They crafted flower brooches which Mrs Goldstraw had crocheted (thanks so much Mrs Goldstraw).


The Mums and Grandmas then had a cream tea and the afternoon was finished off with the children singing "Don't forget"....(to tell your mum you love her) to their guests.

More details will follow next week.




Drawing competition

<u>Tik Tok</u>

TikTok is setting a 60-minute default daily screen time limit for users who are aged under 18. If young people hit the new limit, they will have to enter a passcode to continue to use the service that day. This will be rolled out over the next few weeks and will be automatically applied to users under 18 years old.





<u>Sparks</u>

Sparks class have been learning about the life cycle of a plant in their Science class. They started their journey as a seed and acted out how they grew in to a plant.

They have been learning about "The Easter Story." They role played Jesus riding on a donkey surrounded by his disciples shouting "Hosanna!"

They then made the shape of the cross with their bodies.


They finally opened the treasure chest that they found by following their treasure map. They took a look at what was inside. They found a picture, a book and parrots!

<u>Flames</u>


The children are learning about The Easter Story this term. This week Flames class were re-enacting what happened on Good Friday.
