



What to do if an individual becomes unwell with COVID-19 symptoms

Prevention Measure 1 - Minimise contact with individuals who are unwell.

Updated 23rd Feb 2021 using Government Guidance 22nd Feb 2021

Staff or Pupil becomes unwell at school with:

- **A new and continuous/persistent cough**
(coughing a lot for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours)
- **A high temperature** (Hot to the touch on chest or back)
- **Loss or change to taste or smell** is noticed

Seriously ill – Call 999!

Staff member on daily cleaning rota

Clean and disinfect classroom area

Everyone in that class/ bubble to wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and running water.

Office Manager / Headteacher

Call parent to collect child



Supervising member of staff

Disposable mask to be placed onto child.

Member of staff to put on PPE and move the child to the staffroom, open the windows and close the door placing a 'no entry' sign on it.

Child to use disabled toilet bathroom if needed.
No entry sign to be placed on the door.

Staffroom and Disabled toilet to be cleaned and disinfected.

PPE used during this event to be double bagged and stored in outdoor shed for 72 hours and

Supervising member of staff to stay in school unless COVID symptoms develop.

When the child is collected by their parent

Parent should arrange a COVID-19 test as soon as possible. Given a home test kit by the school or pointed to the link by which to book one. A test centre is preferable.

Child, household members and members of support or childcare bubble MUST isolate for the next 10 days.

AND Report to Local Authority Council's Covid-19 Local Outbreak Co-ordinating Team using the Online reporting system

When the COVID Test result is received

POSITIVE TEST result (with symptoms) – continue to self-isolate for 10 days)

Household members and bubble contacts to self-isolate for 10 days.

POSITIVE TEST result (with no symptoms but then symptoms develop) – re-start the 10 day isolation period from the onset of symptoms.

Household members self-isolate for 10 days from first day of individuals symptoms.

NEGATIVE TEST result

If you have no further symptoms you can return to school.

The school will need evidence of the negative test result if the full isolation period is not over.
