#### School Trips

As you have probably noticed from the diary dates there are some upcoming school trips booked!

This week we have confirmed another trip to The Open Centre in Derby to partake in The Faith Trail, as part of their Religious Education.

The trip will take place on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> October. Please can all children be in school for 8.40am on that morning as the coach will leave at 8.45am.

Whilst there they will visit a Hindu temple, a Mosque and a Sikh Gurdwara.

The children will learn about different cultures and worship. Please could they bring a scarf to cover their heads in some of the places of worship.

The cost of the trip if £6.70 and payable on Parentpay.

We have two Christmas trips booked!

The children are going to watch "The Nutcracker" at The New Vic Theatre on Friday 1st December.

The cost of the trip is £14 and payable on Parent Pay

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December they will be visiting The National Adventure Farm and partake in "The North Pole Adventure"

The cost of this trip is £17 and payable on Parent pay also.

We know these are a way off however we also realise that times are expensive at the moment, as is Christmas, so we wanted to give you plenty of notice.

We are very lucky this year to have the support of the Trustees who have kindly agreed to pay for coaches for our trips up to a certain amount therefore we only have to charge for entrance fees. Thank you very much to our Trustees.

Lastly, we have confirmed the dates for next year's Year 3 and Year 4 residential trip to Gulliver's Kingdom. This has been booked for  $24^{th}$  –  $26^{th}$  June.

Again, this payment item is on Parentpay and can be paid in instalments after the initial deposit of £49 is received by 26th January 2024.

There will be plenty of reminders nearer the time but we wanted to take the stress out of the cost a little.





#### Free school meals

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
  - the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross
  income of no more than £16,190)
  - Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
  - Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

This also includes Key Stage 1 children (Reception to Year 2) who receive universal free school meals. If your application is successful the school receives Pupil Premium funding. Pupil premium funding is additional funding for schools to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged pupils.

On Wednesday the children had a "Wild Worship" assembly outside.


They talked about God's creations, nature and closed their eyes to Isiten to the birds. They then said "The Wild Worshipper's Prayer"

#### **Flickers**


Flickers Class were learning and drawing about the food chain on Welly Wednesday also. They drew pictures of the creatures they spotted on the school field that would become another creatures food!






 $\label{thm:local_problem} \textit{Year 1's have been using a colour wheel mixing two primary colours together to make a secondary colour.}$
