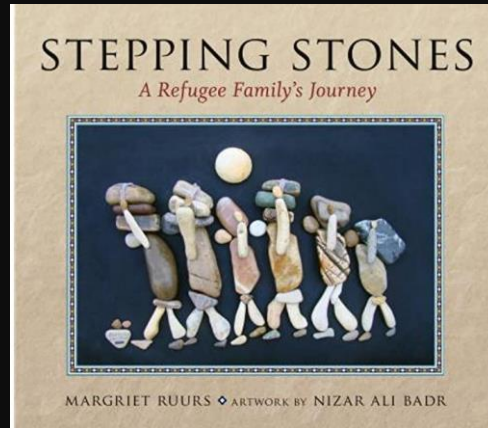

Look at the front cover of this weeks story. Can you predict what the story will be about?





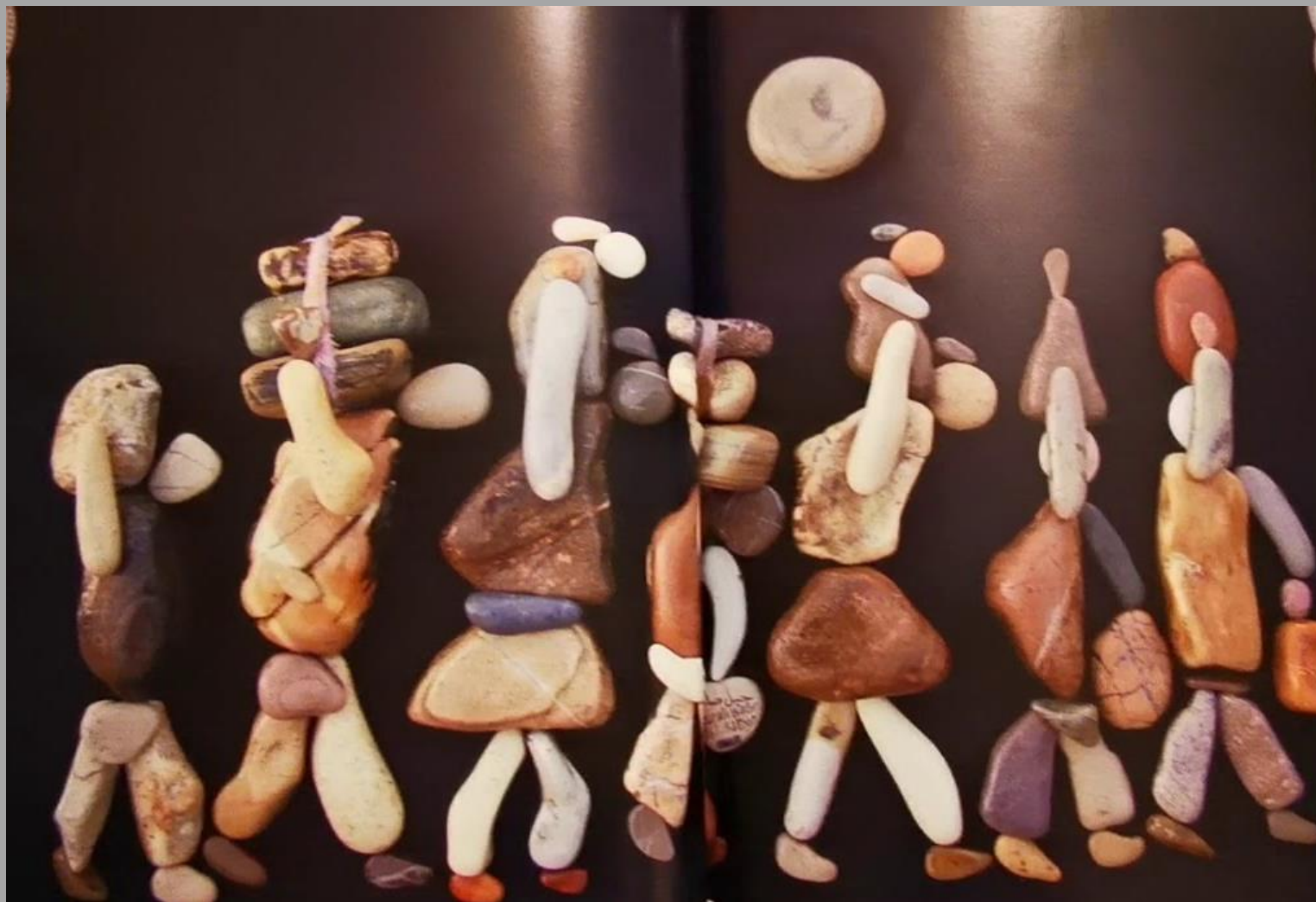
Look carefully at the pictures from the story on the next four slides. These pictures are photographs of stone artwork by Nizar Ali Badr a man living in Syria. A country at war.

Remember to use capital letters, full stops and other punctuation.







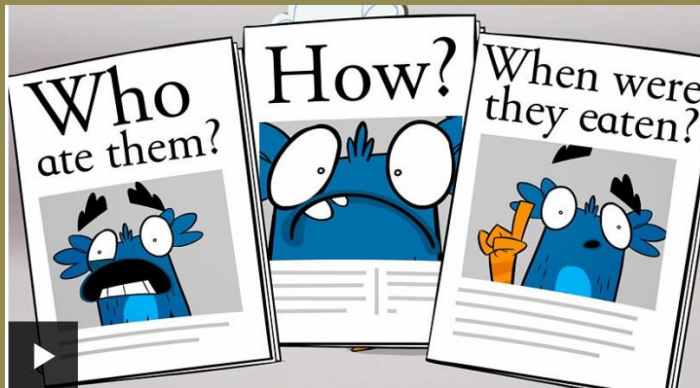

# Year 2

## Statements and questions

A sentence must start with a **capital letter** and end with a **full stop**, a **question mark** or an **exclamation mark**. There are different types of sentence.

A **statement** is a sentence that tells you something. It starts with a capital letter and ends with a full stop.

*A shark has hundreds of teeth.*

A **question** is a sentence that asks something. It starts with a capital letter and ends with a question mark.

*What do sharks eat?*
