
Wraparound care

Sparks

This week Sparks class have been very busy, not only settling in to class beautifully, but also they have made Space monsters using shapes and colours, they have been practising their writing on the whiteboard table, they have played in the mud kitchen and they have been reading in the bath.



Flickers

Flickers class have been making moon buggies this week.

They used Meccano to build their vehicles.



They have also been reminding each other of the school rules according to Mr Potato Head.

The school rules are Listening ears, walking feet, kind mouth, loving hearts, looking eyes, thinking caps and helpful hands.



Flames

Flames class have been learning about the solar system and are making their own solar system model using polystyrene balls.

They learned how to remember all the planets names by using mnemonics. So for the planets names, Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune and Pluto.

The rhyme they used is "My Very Easy Method Just Speeds Up Naming planets".

They did really well and were able to name all planets after the second attempt using this method.
