Around 35 million $X$ users are under 18 so it's essential that parents and carers stay up to date with the changes made to Twitter since its reinvention as $X$ - and the online safety hazards these alterations might pose, including exposure to explicit content and unpleasant behaviour.

That's not to say, however, that $X$ is a ruined platform: a more cautious approach can still enable young people to navigate it comparatively safely. This week's guide suggests some steps that can help children avoid common pitfalls - both new and old - on $X$.
